IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR EMERGECY PERSONNEL

The individual carrying this card works in a laboratory with Neisseria meningitidis and may have come into contact via accidental parenteral inoculation, exposure of mucous membranes to infectious droplet nuclei or aerosols, or ingestion.

Note: This card is intended to be informational and should not substitute for clinical presentation and provider judgment of individual clinical cases.

MEDICAL ALERT INFORMATION

The person carrying this card has an occupational exposure to Neisseria meningitidis. Immediately call Occupational Health at 301.405.3315

COMMON SYMPTOMS

- Incubation period period 2-10 days (avg 2-4 days)
- Presenting symptoms
 - Mild sore throat - Fever, severe headache, stiff neck

POST-EXPOSURE TREATMENT

- Thoroughly wash any skin wounds with soap and water and/or flush eves or other affected mucous membranes with water
- Treat as soon as possible (ideally within 24 hours
- of exposure) with one of the following :
 Oral rifampin (10 mg/kg [max 600 mg] orally
- twice daily, for 2 days)
 Intramuscular ceftriaxone (250 mg, single-dose) - Oral ciprofloxacin (20 mg/kg [max 500 mg] orally, single-dose)
